What is the story behind the Annual Report form moving online?

Dr. Theresa Lua, General Secretary of the ATA, reports that for many years now, the ATA has struggled to respond to questions and requests concerning the number of students in our institutions, total numbers of graduates, program numbers, student numbers per program, faculty qualifications and their specializations. External organizations such as ICETE, regional training partners, and funding agencies all want to know what is happening in Asian theological education. They (and we, the ATA) need hard data on the ATA member institutions and schools. This data is needed to help in making decisions, supporting institutions and their



programs, understanding existing training provisions and identifying new training needs across Asia.

Dr. Lua notes it has recently been said, "Church growth is like a bullet train but theological education is like a bicycle" - struggling to keep up. We really need to know how many pastors and leaders we are training each year. We also need statistics that will help us to know how many pastors in the region do not yet have adequate training. Research being done in Asia needs to be supported by solid statistical information. Knowing the number of graduates, particular programs, number of students, faculty, especially in terms of their qualifications and specializations will help the ATA to identify faculty development training needs, including what further collaborations are needed to support the task of theological education in Asia.

Dr. Lua adds "I am very glad that we are now able to have a digital Annual Report form, supported by data gathering and analytics... We hope that our member institutions will really help us in gathering this data."

The Annual Report is required for all ATA member institutions

Dr. Rick Weymouth, Associate Secretary for Accreditation, has been following the development of the Annual Report online form, and a brand-new Online Accreditation system (ATA OA), which is nearly but not yet available. (More on this new OA system in the next ATA News.) However, the Annual Report online form is now live and ready to receive member institution's Annual Reports. Dr. Weymouth notes that submitting the Annual Report form is compulsory for member institutions. *Just as non-payment of annual fees can result in losing both ATA membership and accreditation, so also can non-submission of the Annual Report form.* It is one of the key responsibilities of institutions to the ATA, alongside fulfillment

of the accreditation tasks set by Visiting Evaluation Teams every five years in the ATA's Accreditation cycle.

Dr. Weymouth says the Annual Report form also allows member schools to provide updates on their compliance with ATA recommendations and notations and to advise of any significant personnel, institutional or program changes or developments. "This keeps the ATA in touch with what is happening in your school and helps us to see the progress you are making in improving your ability to serve your students better, year by year, and this helps us to help your school better, too." With the provision of data collection and analytics available to us through the new online form, he adds, "the ATA will also be able to serve the whole region and specific Asian countries better."

Getting Started: Create an Institutional Account for the online Annual Report

Once again, go to the ATA website, https://ATAasia.com – then first open the Membership menu, and click on Annual Report online form to get started. Then click on either the "Get Started" (first-time users) or "Member Login" (returning




users) button.

The Get Started option allows you to register your institution on the ATA website for the Annual Report form. Instructions are provided for subsequent logins and for completing the Annual Report form. Information can be saved as you work, so that users can log off, return and login again later, and complete the form over several days or a week before finally submitting it.






The online Annual Report is designed to allow for various options to be selected quickly as institutional leaders complete the form, as shown in the screenshots here for Question #5. Program Summary for the Recent Academic Year, and for Question #8. Educators in Campus-Based Programs. However, some typing (or copy and pasting) will also be needed.





In subsequent years, some of this data may be pre-filled for the next Annual Report but such data will require both careful checking and updating.

Upon submission, a PDF copy of the submitted Annual Report may be downloaded for your own records. However, from 2025 onwards, all Annual Reports submitted online, year by year, will also be accessible through the ATA digital portal.

Redefining Holistic Formation for Digital Natives: ATA India's AGM and Theological Consultation 2025 By Poter Francia Digital Media Secretary, ATA India

ATA India held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Theological Consultation 2025 from September 9-12, 2025, at the Four Points by Sheraton, Mahabalipuram, Tamil Nadu. The serene coastal ambience and world-class facilities of the venue provided a refreshing and inspiring environment that enhanced the spirit of fellowship, learning, and reflection throughout the gathering.

Building on a Continuing Conversation

The 2024 consultation focused on "Theological Education for Digital Natives", examining how evolving learning habits challenge traditional pedagogies. This year, ATA India built upon those vital discussions, moving from understanding how digital natives learn to exploring how they can be formed - spiritually, morally, and ministerially.

Hence, the theme for the Theological Consultation 2025 was: "Theological Education Meets Technology: Redefining Holistic Formation for Digital Natives."

This theme invited participants to reflect deeply on the integration of technology into theological formation. How might digital tools be used meaningfully to nurture character, spirituality, and ministerial competence in a tech-saturated age? How can educators disciple and mentor future leaders without compromising the theological depth and integrity of their calling?

Engagement and Participation

Over 140 participants from theological institutions across India actively engaged in the four-day gathering. The Consultation featured 5 plenary speakers, 6 panellists, 13 breakout session presenters, and 3 devotional speakers, representing a diverse and dynamic exchange of ideas.

Highlights from the Sessions

Dr. Marvin spoke on "Character and Virtue in Theological Education." Using Mentimeter, he kept the audience thoughtfully engaged through live polls and reflective questions, prompting participants to reimagine how virtue can be intentionally cultivated in theological learning.





Dr. Buno Iralu addressed
"Who Digital Natives
Are?", unpacking their unique challenges and needs.
She emphasised the urgent need for new educational infrastructures that adapt to changing modes of learning and digital realities.



Dr. Bennet Lawrence explored "Digital Natives and Theological Education", challenging educators to innovate pedagogical methodologies that ensure effective learning and spiritual depth among digital-native students.

Pastor Freddy Joseph offered an inspiring reflection from his ministry experience, emphasising that discipleship is not merely knowledge transfer but life transfer. Drawing from the models of Jesus and Paul, he urged institutions to mentor students intentionally, combining academic excellence with spiritual formation and field exposure.





Dr. John Daniel presented on "Integrating Theological Education with Spiritual Formation in Residential Seminaries." Addressing existing challenges, he reminded participants that the call is not to lower standards, but to align scholarship with mission, urging theological educators to produce leaders who are skilled, spiritually mature, resilient, and Christlike.

The Panel Discussions had six panellists representing diverse theological institutions who shared how their campuses foster formation among students. Their reflections on guiding digital natives through a thoughtful blend of technology and embodied practices demonstrated that deep, authentic formation is indeed possible, when educators are intentional and relational.

The 13 breakout sessions provided space for participants to delve into specific topics of interest. The theologians presenting papers stimulated rich dialogue and mutual learning, contributing to ATA India's ongoing vision for contextually relevant, transformative theological education.

Beyond the sessions, participants enjoyed moments of fellowship and cultural enrichment through a Heritage Tour in Mahabalipuram. Exploring the historic temples and rock monuments offered both relaxation and a time of fellowship among the participants.

Conclusion

As ATA India continues its commitment to shaping the future of theological education, the 2025 Consultation reaffirmed that technology, when used with wisdom and purpose, can serve as a powerful ally in forming Christlike leaders. Rather than replacing personal mentoring and spiritual depth, technology can enhance access, creativity, and engagement in theological learning. The gathering reminded all that the heart of theological education remains the same: to raise leaders who think deeply, live faithfully, and serve effectively in today's digital world.
